Data Privacy Related

Litigated Matters

- Prevailed on a motion for summary judgment in the District Court of New Jersey in a matter where the consumer alleged that the debt collector client had violated the FDCPA and TCPA by making repeated phone calls to his cell phone in order to harass, abuse, and coerce payment.
- Second chaired a trial in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Burlington County, in a matter involving claims brought
 under the Uniform Commercial Code for non-conforming goods, which ultimately resulted in a favorable post-trial
 settlement.

 third-party insurer.
